



A MESSAGE FROM FATHER SLAWEK



Praise be Jesus Christ... Now and Forever.

I want to extend my heartfelt gratitude to everyone who attended the Mass celebrating my installation as your pastor. Your presence, prayers, and support truly made me feel at home. A special thank you to the liturgy committee for their hard work in preparing a beautiful and reverent celebration, to the choir for

lifting our hearts in song, and to those who served during the Mass and at the reception and who provided the tasty baked desserts. A special thank you to Helen's Deli for providing the delicious Polish food for all. Your generosity and dedication reflect the deep faith and love that make our parish a welcoming community.

I was especially honored to have Bishop Hicks here to celebrate this special Mass with us on such a holy day, the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. His presence was a blessing, reminding us of our connection to the universal Church and our shared mission as disciples of Christ. This celebration was not just about welcoming me, but about coming together as a parish family, rooted in faith and ready to continue our journey together. Thank you for making this such a joyful and memorable occasion!

On Saturday, February 8, we had the great joy of welcoming 44 second graders who received their First Reconciliation. Please keep them in your prayers as they experience God's mercy in this beautiful sacrament. Then today, Sunday, February 9, we have a special day of prayer for married couples. Marriage is a sacred vocation, and we ask for God's grace to strengthen and bless all couples in their love and commitment to one another.

In the Gospel of Luke, we hear the familiar yet powerful story of Simon Peter, who, after a long night of fishing, comes to shore with empty nets. He is tired and discouraged when Jesus tells him to go back out into the deep and lower his nets again. At first, Simon Peter hesitates - he doubts that anything will change. Yet, in faith, he obeys, and what happens next is nothing short of miraculous. His nets are filled to the point of breaking, a sign that with Jesus, abundance follows trust.

This Gospel reminds us that we, too, must place our trust in Jesus, even when it seems difficult or when we are discouraged. How often do we, like Simon Peter, feel like our efforts are in vain? But Jesus calls us to deeper faith, to cast our nets once more, even when it doesn't make sense. If we trust Him, He will provide - not always in the ways we expect, but always in the ways we need. Let us ask for the grace to follow His word with confidence, knowing that He will never leave us empty-handed.

We humbly ask all parishioners to pledge their support for this important effort.


This year's CMAA theme is *Open your heart to God's goodness*.
