

A MESSAGE FROM FATHER SLAWEK

Praise be Jesus Christ... Now and Forever!!

Jesus is transfigured on the mountain in the presence of Peter, James, and John.

For the second Sunday of Lent, we move from Jesus' retreat to the desert to his Transfiguration. Each year on the first Sunday of Lent, our Gospel tells the story of Jesus' temptation in the desert. On the second Sunday of Lent each year, we hear the story of Jesus' Transfiguration.

The story of Jesus' Transfiguration is told in the three Synoptic Gospels: Matthew, Mark, and Luke. In each of those Gospels, the Transfiguration follows Jesus' first prediction of his death and his teaching about the costs of discipleship. Jesus' Transfiguration is a promise of Jesus' glory, his Resurrection.

On a mountain in today's reading, a voice affirms that Jesus is God's Son in words reminiscent of the voice at Jesus' baptism. In addition, the appearance of Moses and Elijah on the mountain connects this story with God's relationship to the people of Israel. Moses and Elijah represent the Law and the Prophets, respectively. Together with Jesus, they represent God's complete Word.

The Transfiguration occurs in the presence of just three of Jesus' disciples: Peter, James, and John. In Matthew's Gospel, those disciples are among the first whom Jesus calls. The three men are identified as an "inner circle" among Jesus' disciples when Jesus asks them to accompany him to the Garden of Gethsemane just before his arrest.

I am happy to be able to have real live votive candles for all to use. Lighting candles in the Catholic Church is a symbolic act of prayer, devotion, and faith. When a candle is lit, it signifies a prayerful intention offered to God, the Blessed Mother, or the saints, continuing even after the person has left the church. Many of you appreciate the opportunity to light a candle as a visible sign of your prayers, whether for loved ones, personal intentions, or gratitude. This tradition reflects our trust in God's presence and intercession, serving as a sign of hope, remembrance, and petition for divine assistance. These votive candles will serve as a constant reminder of the power of prayer and the communal support of the faith community.

I would like to express my heartfelt gratitude to Joey and Nicole Santo of the Culture Studio for their very generous donation of T-shirts for the school and church ushers. Your kindness and support mean so much to our church, providing not only a practical gift but also a sense of unity and pride among those who serve. Your generosity reflects a deep commitment to helping others, and we are truly blessed by your thoughtfulness. I've already heard many compliments that our ushers look so great in blue!! Thank you again, Joey and Nicole.



May God continue to bless us all on our Lenten journeys as we prepare for His Passion, Cross and Resurrection.


